Come to Fordham Law School this summer and study U.S. Law in the heart of Manhattan.

This two-week program gives foreign-trained lawyers and law students an opportunity to learn about U.S. law at one of the top law schools in the United States. Students will take classes at Fordham Law School, located in the heart of New York City, where they will be taught by leaders in U.S. and international law.

Accommodations

Accommodations will be in dormitory-style housing at Fordham's beautiful Rose Hill campus, easily accessible by Fordham-run and public transportation. There will be two students to a room, each with a private bath.

Cost

The cost for this two-week program is \$2,200, which includes tuition, course materials, housing, breakfast on all days, lunch on most days, public transportation, and select events, including a tour of the United Nations, a welcome reception, and a closing ceremonial dinner. Additional activities will be organized and made available for an additional activity fee.

Eligibility

All law students and law school graduates with English-language proficiency are eligible to enroll in this program.

Application Procedure

Send the attached application and a deposit of \$500 by May 18. Final payment is due by June 22. Space is limited, so early applications are encouraged.

Certificate

Students will receive a certificate of completion at the conclusion of the program.
